



**2024 AID Membership Course  
Delivered by the Australian Institute of Dermatology**

Thank you for your enquiry about the AID Membership Course. The course is open to all Medical graduates in Australia or Overseas. It will commence in Feb 2024 and run over two semesters of 14 weeks each. The course concentrates on skin diagnosis and treatment which are the fundamental elements of practicing good skin disease management.

**The Australian Institute of Dermatology is based at the John Flynn Private Hospital on the Gold Coast, Queensland, Australia, specializing in online education in Dermatology** See [www.learndermatology.com](http://www.learndermatology.com) and [www.aideducational.com](http://www.aideducational.com)

**Course Hardware Requirements** Mac running Leopard operating system or later or PC Computer running Windows 8 or 10 or 11 with a broadband internet connection, or a good wireless connection. A digital camera should be purchased such as the Canon Powershot or the Sony Cybershot series which are easy to use and have excellent macros for taking close up images. The Nikon Coolpix range are also good. Modern Phone Cameras are also acceptable with images transferred to your computer.

**Course Software and Books** You should purchase a copy of Clinical Dermatology by Habif. Get the 7th e edition with website access although the book itself is all that is required for the course. You should also have an Image management program such as [ACD See](#) This allows you to organize and resize your clinical images.

**Course Delivery** The course will be delivered using the Institute's websites [www.aiddiploma.com](http://www.aiddiploma.com) and [www.aidmembership.com](http://www.aidmembership.com) over 14 two weekly modules, 7 in each semester. In the first week of each module you are expected to read the online module and the relevant chapters in Habif and view the videos associated with that module. At the end of each module there are some MCQs and a written module assessment which you complete online. A Blog runs in the second week of each module where there will be daily cases illustrating features of the topics discussed in the module and a podcast and video explaining the case at the conclusion of the discussion. This blog provides a forum for interaction by the students and their tutor. Students can also submit cases to the Virtual Clinical Meeting site for discussion with their Tutor.

**Teleconferences** There will be two, 1 hour video teleconferences , 1 each week, for each module. These are video teleconferences using the Go To Meeting facility during which you will be able to see my monitor screen and interact during my talk. These webinars are all recorded for later viewing. This will be useful if you are unable to make a particular online meeting. These will be run from 7.00-8.00 PM Thursday evenings Australian Eastern Standard time . (plus 10 hrs GMT) The webinars often start 15 mins earlier to discuss cases submitted by candidates to the Virtual Clinical Meeting.

**Assessment** You will be assessed on your written module questions on an ongoing basis, the quality of the 10 cases you submit to the virtual clinical meeting and your results in the two online live examinations held at the end of each Semester. The Exam results make up 60% of your final assessment, the two weekly module assessments make up 30% and your Cases in the VCM make up 10% of the Course assessment. You are required to upload 5 cases each semester from your own practice. These are presented by you in the Virtual Clinical Meeting section of the course website, where I and your Tutor will comment on them.

**Tutors** You will be assigned a Tutor when you begin the course. All Tutors are GPs who have passed the Course with Credit or Distinction. They mark your Module assessments every two weeks and give you feedback. They also comment along with myself on your cases in the Virtual Clinical Meeting. They are available to answer any other questions you might have during the course on content or other cases you are seeing in your practice.

**Cost of the Membership Course** The fee for the course, including the weekend meeting, will be \$3650 (Aus) early bird if paid before 1<sup>st</sup> December 2023 or \$3950 if paid after that date. All fees must be paid 4 weeks before the course begins. The initial deposit to secure a place in the course is \$1000 with the balance payable in full before the cut off dates above. See the Registration form for full payment details. Candidates who pass the Membership Course will have ongoing access for 1 year to the course websites and the virtual clinical meeting site. They will also be eligible to attend the Alumni webinars in subsequent years. These are held every two weeks during the teaching semesters. If you pass the Membership course you can take the Advanced Surgical course and Fellowship courses in subsequent years.

**The Learn Dermatology Blog** will be used to illustrate and describe cases relevant to each of the modules being discussed. Daily cases will be posted here in the second week of each module. A podcast will accompany each case and a video discussion.

**Continuing Professional Development Points** The Institute awards 30 Cat 1 points for the Reading of the Module material and the Links. The 10 cases you submit to the VCM are awarded 10 Cat 2 points. Your answers to the Assessment Cases and video reviews of the answers are awarded 20 Cat 3 points. Each Semester examination is awarded 10 Cat 2 points. Overall the course offers 80 hours of CPD points.

**Starting Dates** The course will commence with the Weekend Workshop on the 27th and 28<sup>th</sup> January 2024. This will be a Virtual Conference which will be recorded. The first examination online will be at the end of the first semester around 9<sup>th</sup> May

There is a 4 week break between Semesters from the 13<sup>th</sup> May to the 10<sup>th</sup> June. The Second Semester will run from the 10<sup>th</sup> June until the 16<sup>th</sup> Sept The Second Semester exam will be around the 19<sup>th</sup> September

**Preliminary Video Teleconferences** These will start in mid Nov 2023 to allow you to become familiar with the system used. We recommend you purchase a USB headset which combines headphones and a microphone such as the Logitech Clear Chat USB headphones costing around \$45 Accessing these teleconferences also allows you to become familiar with Teledermatology Consultations.

**You will also be invited to attend the Alumni Case discussion webinars in 2023 which are held every two weeks for previous graduates of the course from when you pay your deposit to join the Membership course in 2024.**

We suggest 6-8 hours per week is required including the webinars.
